Welcome to the Bridge River Valley!

The Bridge River Valley is within the traditional territory of the St'át'imc. The Tsal'almec St'át'imc utilized this land for millenniums for harvesting, hunting, trapping and as a through way to trade with both coastal and interior peoples. Trails and routes developed by the Tsal'almec were used by the earliest prospectors as they made their way into the area.

Travelling in BC is a little different in 2020. Please take more time with planning, and be more conscious of your impact on Bridge River Valley residents and our communities. 1. PLAN AHEAD

Take extra time to research and plan your trip in advance. Visit www.bridgerivervalley.ca to see what's open and hours of operation.

2. BE RESPECTFUL

Responsible tourism means that the experience creates a positive impact for all involved—not just the traveller. Keep in mind that you're a guest of your fellow Bridge River Valley residents when travelling, and respect any guidelines and protocols they've put in place in their community during this time.

3. TRAVEL IN SMALLER GROUPS

If you normally travel with extended family or with several friends, consider travelling in a smaller group this summer. Travelling with fewer people makes it easier for you to practise physical distancing in public, and may have less of an impact on the destination.

4. MORE TIME, FEWER LOCATIONS

Consider a slower travel pace this summer to help curb the spread. Instead of checking in and out of multiple destinations during one trip, choose one destination and one accommodation for your entire trip, and use that as a 'home-base' for exploring all the destinations nearby.

5. PACK ESSENTIALS

Stock up with the essentials before you leave home (i.e. groceries). This helps lessen your impact on Bridge River Valley communities who may be experiencing supply issues, and reduces your touchpoints with communities who may have limited health care facilities. Even better: create a Clean Trip Kit, including hand sanitizer, soap, gloves, masks, and toilet paper.

6. STAY APART, STAY SAFE

Practise physical distancing and frequent handwashing hygiene to help prevent the spread of COVID-19. Follow the recommendations from the BC Centre for Disease Control to learn about preventative activities, and talk to the tourism businesses you are visiting about the steps they are taking to keep you and their staff safe. WorkSafeBC now requires all businesses to post their new COVID-related health and safety protocols at their workplace for staff and visitors to see.

7. LEAVE NO TRACE

When exploring the Bridge River Valley's vast outdoors, always leave it in a better state than when you arrived. Respect local wildlife. Minimize campfire impacts and check BC Wildfire Service for fire bans and fire safety tips. Pack out what you pack in, and dispose of waste properly. These are just some of key principles of Leave No Trace, a set of seven guidelines for enjoying the outdoors responsibly while minimizing your impact on the landscape. Visit Leave No Trace and BC Wildfire to learn more.

8. BE ADVENTURESMAART

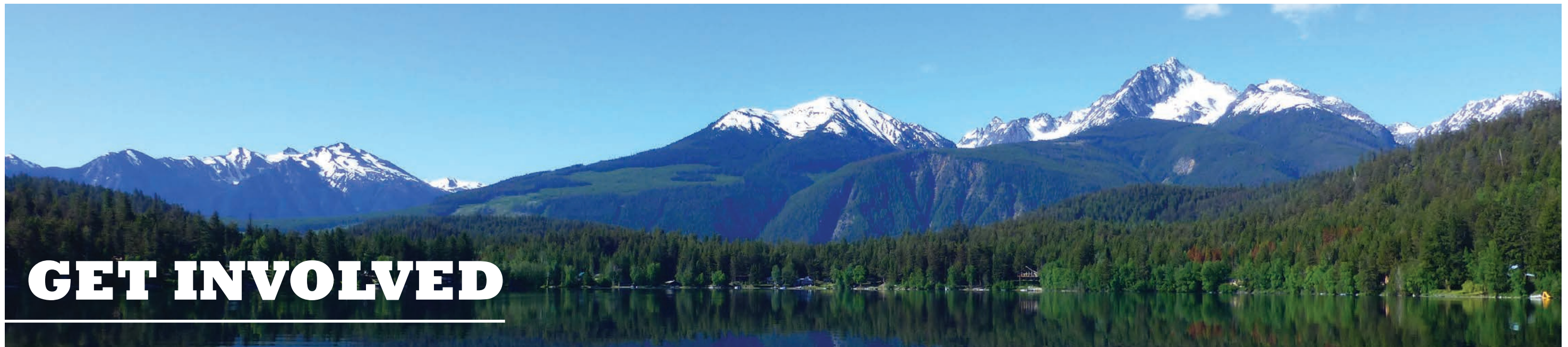
No matter what outdoor activity you are planning, you must be prepared. Remember to follow the three Ts—trip planning, training, and taking the essentials. AdventureSmart is a great resource to get informed before heading outdoors. There is no cellular service in the Bridge River Valley and limited emergency services. Be fully prepared for any emergency and wilderness first aid.

9. BE CALM, BE PATIENT, BE KIND

Remember, activities may take longer than usual, or places may be at capacity when you arrive. Have a Plan B researched and ready in case your first choice isn't possible. Be calm, patient, and kind, and remember, we're all in this together.

10. SUPPORT LOCAL BUSINESSES

BC's tourism businesses are eager to welcome you back this summer and your support is more crucial than ever. Remember, with the international border closed, our businesses are relying on local support now more than ever. 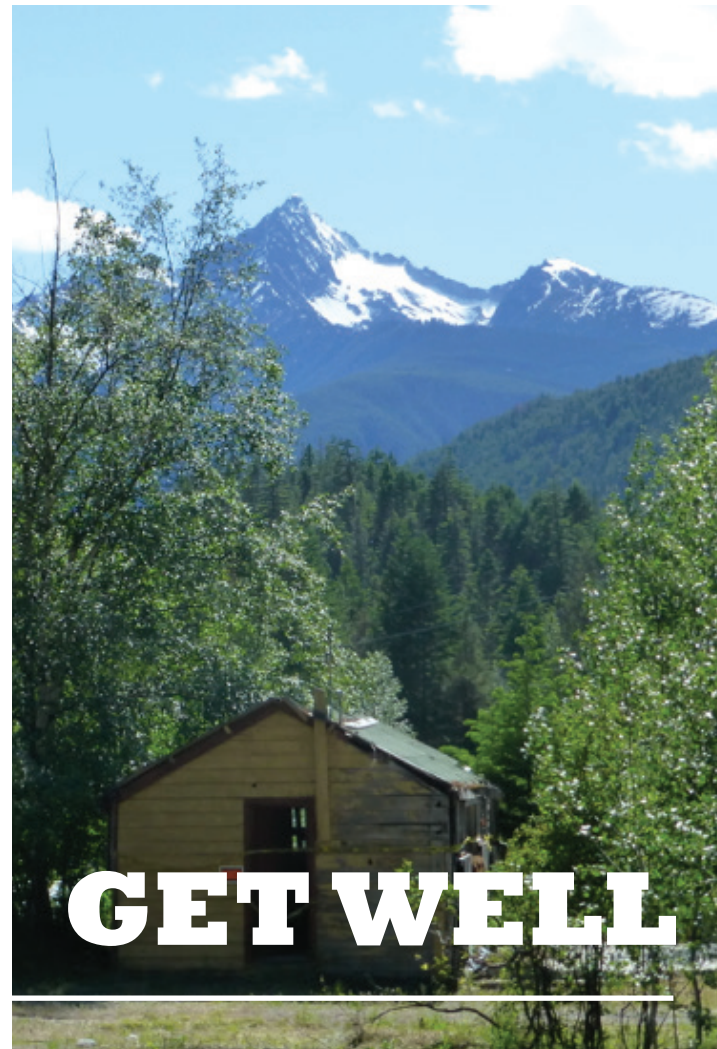

Public Health Nurse

Interior Public Health provides a Public Health Nurse to the Bridge River Valley through their Lillooet Branch Office. The Public Health Nurse is in Gold Bridge one day per month and sets up office in the Ambulance Station, where residents can pre-make appointments.

The Public Health Nurse also visits the Gold Bridge Community School on a regular basis and does home visits as needed by the community.

Interior Public Health provides immunization for all ages, prenatal support, school education, and homes visits by the Public Health Nurse to the residents of the BRV. Vision screening is offered once per year for the students at Gold Bridge Community School.

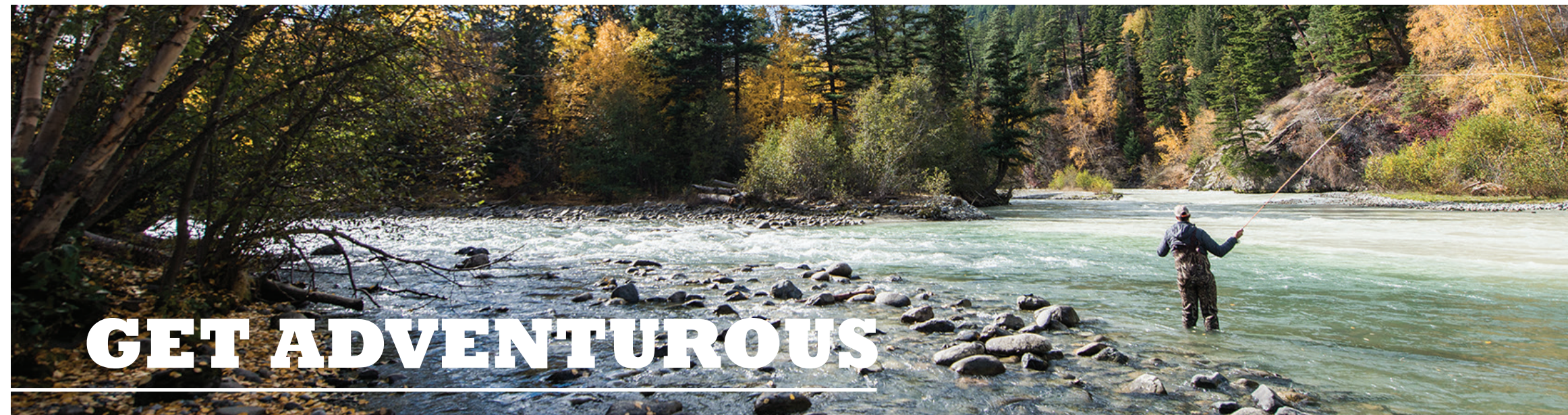

Tyaughton Lake - Located on the western shore of Tyaughton Lake. From Gold Bridge proceed Northeast along Highway 40. Turn left onto Tyaughton Lake Road.

Gun Creek Hydro Site

Gold Bridge - Located approximately 8.5 km northeast of Gold Bridge and 91km Northwest of Lillooet, on Carpenter Lake Reservoir.

Gun Lake Forest Service Campground

Gun Lake - Access via Gun Lake Road and the Gun Lake Road West.

Gwenyth Lake Forest Service Campground

Hurley FSR - Gwenyth Lake Park is West of Lillooet and North of Pemberton. The campsite is accessed from the Hurley Forest Service Road.

Kingdom Lake Forest Service Campground

In Bralorne, take the Kingdom Lake Forest Service Road. Turn left at the campsite sign and follow this road down into the campsite.

Marshall Lake Campsites

Located north of Carpenter Lake. Proceed 72 km west along Highway 40 until you see Marshall Lake Road North and turn right. Follow this road until 1m 89. Then turn left and follow for 1km until you see the site.

Boat Launch - Gun Lake

If you are looking to explore BRV from the lake side a public boat launch is made available on the south end of Gun Lake. This boat launch is maintained by the Gun Lake Boat Launch committee through fundraising initiatives including the yearly Italian Day event and through the Boat Launch Donation Box.
